What exactly: Greenwood is a new nonprofit organization and historic estate that is now a public garden and national heritage site. Due to the delicate and, in some areas, unstable condition of the garden structures Greenwood is open the public by guided tours only in 2006.

However, on October 1st we are holding an event dedicated to artists, where artists who are inspired by the world outdoors will be painting throughout this early twentieth-century, 28-acre Arts and Crafts-era garden. The public will be wandering the gardens as well, guided by volunteers and staff knowledgeable of the history and horticulture of the heritage site. It will be a great opportunity to share your art with others, but there is no requirement that you “engage the visitors.” You are there to enjoy the beauty like they are and to paint or draw.
