Grounds for Sculpture - New Jersey's foremost Sculpture Park and Museum

More than 250 large-scale Sculptures on over 35 Magnificently Landscaped Acres along with 2 museum buildings, a visitor's center, and 2 restaurants. Located in Hamilton, on the site of the former N.J. State Fairgrounds. **IT'S SPECTACULAR!!**

The outdoor exhibition grows by approximately 15 sculptures annually. They are selected to augment indoor exhibitions and to work in conjunction with the landscaped environment.

Princeton University Art Museum – One of the leading university art museums in the country. The collections have grown to over 72,000 works of art that range from ancient to contemporary works.

Princeton University Campus Tour – Optional - Guided tour to include the University Chapel and Nassau Hall, a 1756 building which served as a barracks and hospital during the Revolutionary War. Sculptures including works by Alexander Calder, Henry Moore, Louise Nevelson & Pablo Picasso, are on campus.
